

Thanks to the tremendous support and generosity of our membership, private/public donors and grant funders, Fox Cities Greenways, Inc. has donated the first of two trishaws to Make the Ride Happen.

Cycling Without Age, Lutheran Social Services, Volunteer Fox Cities, East Central Regional Planning Commission, Wisconsin Bike Fed, Make the Ride Happen and Fox Cities Greenways, Inc. have partnered to develop this unique program, which provides the opportunity for older adults and those with differing abilities to schedule

free trishaw rides piloted by trained volunteers. Make the Ride Happen, a program of Lutheran Social Services, which currently provides vehicular rides for non-driving older adults, will fold Cycling Without Age into its existing program.

Everyone touched by this initiative feels the joy; passengers, pilots and those they meet along the way. Carol Bloemer, RSVP Director, notes "It has been a pleasure to learn what motivates volunteers to become trishaw pilots. One newly trained volunteer pilot hopes to pedal passengers to the park for free band concerts in order to share her love of music and companionship. Cycling Without Age is a win-win for everyone." Fox River Boardwalk - Update

Since its inception many years ago, the Rails-to-Trails program has encouraged many communities to acquire abandoned rail lines and convert the grade for recreational use. The former rail lines often run through scenic areas while providing a level grade and ready bridges/culverts.

Such is the case of the former CN rail line running along the Fox River in Kaukauna. The City acquired the line which extends from the City's downtown to a point across the river from Little Chute's trail network. A boardwalk (planned 2020 construction) across the Fox River will connect the two trail systems.

Although the City acquired over a mile of rail line, an additional 400 feet is needed to construct a trail to a point directly across from Little Chute. Accordingly, to shorten the bridge span and allow for reduced costs in constructing the boardwalk, the City has applied for Rails-to-Trails acquisition for the 400 feet of current CN rail line. The CN Railroad has agreed to this and the application is process.

Safe Routes To Parks

Last November, Fox Cities Greenways hosted a Safe Routes to Parks workshop. Public parks enhance the quality of life for communities and provide numerous benefits, including economic vitality, land conservation, and improved health outcomes. In fact, evidence supports that having access to green space has a direct impact on the health of individuals. Safe Routes to Parks is a framework to increase safe and equitable access to parks for all people of all abilities. This workshop brought together over 35 community representatives and partners to discuss local efforts in Safe Routes to Parks and provided an opportunity to discuss how to enhance local and regional access to our parks.

Discussions from the workshop were compiled into a final report, which features findings from the workshop along with key recommendations to increasing local and regional safe and equitable access to our parks.
